15th Annual KCTFHR Human Rights Banquet a Success

The Kootenai County Task Force on Human Relations annual human rights banquet was held on April 23 featuring keynoter Dr. Jianli Yang, Ph.D., president of the Initiatives for China. His topic was “A Dissident’s Struggle to Bring Democracy to China.”

Dr. Yang, born in Shandong Province in northern China, was a witness to the 1989 Tiananmen Square massacre of the innocent demonstrators. He returned to the United States and obtained a doctorate in mathematics from The University of California, Berkeley and a doctorate in political economics from Harvard.

He returned to China in 2002 to support the labor movement. The Chinese government arrested him and for five years he was a political prisoner, which resulted in an international outcry for his release. He returned to the United States in 2007 where he works for a democratic free China.

During his keynote before 322 attendees, Yang told the personal story of his imprisonment and ordeal. The second portion of his talk involved a discussion of three Chinas and the struggle for freedom.

The Task Force presented its 2011 “KCTFHR Civil Rights Award” to the Coeur d’Alene Tribe for its numerous contributions and impact on the region’s economic, culture and human rights advancements. The organization presented the 2011 “Bill Wassmuth Memorial Volunteer-of-the-Year Award” to Jeff Crowe from the Bunkhouse Media and Andy Finney of Local Motion Media for their many years of support to the Task Force regarding media productions as well as the new creation of the KCTFHR web site. Long time Task Force Board member Tony Stewart was also a recipient of this year’s volunteer award.

The Task Force presented a one-time “Lifetime Humanitarian Award” to Lidwin Dirne for her many decades of humanitarian contributions to the region including the remarkable Dirne Health Clinic that serves thousands of low-income clients.

The Task Force in partnership with the Human Rights Education Institute uses a portion of the banquet profits

to partner with the North Idaho College Foundation to provide four full-ride minority scholarships each year. This year’s recipients that were introduced to the banquet attendees were Harley J. Adkins, Tunica Biloxi Tribe; Jesse LaSarte, Coeur d’Alene Tribe; Cindy Matthews, Hispanic/Latino community; Eric Pezley, Pacific Islander; and Tevin Hamilton, Blackfoot Tribe.

Marilyn Muehlbach, president of HREI and Tom Carter, executive director of HREI introduced the three high school essay contest winners sponsored by HREI.

6th Annual Moscow CommUNITY Walk Celebration

At Noon on Saturday, April 28th, nearly three-hundred Moscow, Idaho community members joined in the 6th annual Moscow CommUNITY Walk celebration. They first gathered at the city's center in Friendship Square, where the planning committee volunteers gave away brightly colored helium balloons with the Walk logo. Diversity flags and banners were also readied for the event. People were greeted by City Mayor Nancy Chaney, who read her annual Moscow CommUNITY Walk Day Proclamation and stressed the importance of the event to the community, and University of Idaho Provost Doug Baker, on behalf of the University President Duane Nellis, who applauded the cooperative relationship between the university and the town as symbolized by the Walk. Associated Students of the University of Idaho (ASUI) President Samantha Perez also welcomed the Walkers. S. M. Ghazanfar, a founding member of the planning committee, shared a responsive reading with the gathering, emphasizing the fundamental unity of the human family and equality and dignity of all. After songs from the Moscow High School glee, Mayor Chaney and Provost Baker led the group on the seven-block walk to East City Park, accompanied by banners and balloons, with everyone sharing in a symbolic pilgrimage to "Walk on Common Ground."

Some people may wonder: "Why create a community walk?" Moscow is rich in diversity...and differences. Like any other town, our community can become divided on many issues: politics, development, religion, university/town relationships, and others. But regardless of our differences, we share one important attribute: we are all Moscow neighbors. We live together in this community, and our spirit of community is vital to Moscow's success. The Moscow CommUNITY Walk is a celebration of our conviction that, through our various expressions and diverse efforts, we will advance the common cause of enhancing the well-being of our community, and that we gather and walk together in the spirit of mutual respect and acceptance, transcending our differences and affirming the fundamental unity of our community.

Meanwhile, at the park, community, UI and high school volunteers had set up tables and hundreds of chairs. All participants were invited to sit together for a free lunch at the park, catered through donations from local businesses and organizations raised over the past several months by the volunteer planning committee. On the park stage, various artists donated their time to continue with music and dance performances throughout the afternoon: Sesitshaya Marimba group, singer Cooper Trail, Festival Dance ballet students, local children performing Old English Morris dances, and the Mystic Rhythms dancers. Also, there were children's activities: face painting, T-shirt decorating, and games, conducted by high school and UI student volunteers.

More volunteers encouraged attendees to make Community Links. People answered the question, "What links you to our community?" by writing a phrase on a colored slip of paper, then symbolically "linking" themselves by adding it to several paper chains. The 'links' were varied, and included "my many friends," "music," "yoga," "service to the community," "my grandparents," "my children," and many more.

At 1:45pm, the children's bookmark contest awards were announced, this year by School Superintendent Dale Kleinert. Again through community donations, the CommUNITY Walk committee conducted a bookmark contest for elementary school age children encouraging them to consider their role in community building in Moscow and to depict that in a bookmark design. This year over 290 students participated in this CommUNITY Walk outreach project, with 4 winners and 7 runners-up winning gift certificates to participating vendors. It was wonderful to see all the elements that our children consider when thinking about what makes up a community: many depicted diverse gatherings of children; some see music and sports drawing people together; others included University symbols; they drew pictures of schools, shops, businesses and churches; and this year, more than a few included pictures of the yearling

moose which was visiting our community this Spring. 
Lost Horse Press Releases Second Poetry Anthology

In May 2012 Lost Horse Press releases *Before There Is Nowhere to Stand: Palestine • Israel: Poets Respond to the Struggle*, edited by Joan Dobbie, Grace Beeler & Edward Morin.

Since 1948, through six or seven wars and one failed peace process after another, the precious fragment of land known as Israel, known as Palestine, has been holy to too many people. Can there be an end to this conflict? The need to go on hoping forms the bedrock of this book. Jews have a story. Arabs have a story. Jews and Arabs can both be experts at seeing themselves as victims and the other side as implacable foes. This book exists to remind you that the story is not finished, featuring the lyric poem "Dialog Beneath the Light," composed by Peter Marcus and consisting of alternating passages by Mahmoud Darwish and Yehuda Amichai, the recently deceased most beloved poets of Palestine and Israel respectively.

This new book is a companion to the earlier human rights anthology, *I Go to the Ruined Place*, which was reviewed in the Southern Poverty Law Center's magazine, *Teaching Tolerance* (See issue 38 on their online archive: <http://www.tolerance.org/magazine/archives>).

University of Idaho Women's Center: Celebrating 40 Years of Working for Gender Equity

The University of Idaho Women's Center will be celebrating 40 years of working for gender equity in the fall of 2012.

The Women's Center was founded in 1972 to address the high attrition rates of female students on campus. Since then, the Women's Center's role and has evolved to include a breadth of programming that addresses the contemporary issues U-Idaho students now face. Women's Centers exist because gender equity has not been achieved in any country around the world.

Women still earn less than their male peers, with women of color facing an even larger pay gap. Women hold fewer tenured faculty positions and continue to be underrepresented in many fields, which has a direct impact on female students within our own colleges and departments. A series of special programs is planned for the fall of 2012 to honor the hard work of many individuals and groups who have been involved in creating and sustaining the Women's Center over the past four decades.
